

2026-2027 NSERC/CIHR CGRS MASTER'S COMPETITION

DEADLINE

Applications for NSERC and CIHR CGRS M awards must be completed online by 8 pm on Monday, December 1st. Once the online application closes, there is no way to edit or complete any section(s) of the application.

Because all applicants for NSERC, CIHR, and SSHRC use the same online application, students should refer to the CGRS M application instructions housed on the **NSERC website** regardless of whether the application is for a NSERC or CIHR CGRS M.

AWARD VALUES

CGS Master's: \$27,000 for one year

Note: If you held a CGRS M (or the former CGSM) Master's award in the first 12 months of your graduate program, you are not eligible for a CGRS M extension for the second year of your Master's program.

START DATE

Your start date is determined by your registration status in the program of studies for which funding was awarded at the time you receive notification of your award.

If you have already begun the program of studies for which funding was awarded, you may begin your award in May 2026 or September 2026. Exception: If you apply for CGRS Master's support after completing 12 months of study as of December 31st, 2025, you must take up the award in May 2026.

If you have not yet begun the program of studies for which funding was awarded, you may take up the award in May 2026, September 2026, or January 2027.

ELIGIBILITY

NSERC/CIHR CGRS M

* Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or a Protected person as of the deadline date for application.

* Be enrolled in, or intend to apply for full-time admission to an eligible graduate program at the Master's or Doctoral level (Direct Entry) at a Canadian university with a CGRS-M allocation. *Note: Applicants who are not currently enrolled in their intended graduate program must submit an application for admission by the deadline for their intended graduate program.

* Applicants must have **at least** an A-minus (3.5/4.0 at UofT) average in **EACH** of their last two years of

full time study. This is the last two years of a bachelor's program and applies to students currently in the final year of a B.Sc., the first year of a Master's program, or the first year of their Ph.D. (for direct entry Ph.D. students).

* For a maximum duration of 12 months, the award may be held in the 1st or 2nd year of graduate study. Applicants must have completed, as of December 31st, 2025, no more than the full time equivalent of 12 months of graduate studies in a Master's or Direct Entry PhD program.

* An award holder cannot have previously held a NSERC or CIHR Master's award.

* Applicants can submit a maximum of one scholarship application per academic year to either CIHR, NSERC, or SSHRC (Research Portal will allow the application to be submitted to up to three institutions).

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

NSERC/CIHR CGRS M

To apply for the CGRS M scholarships, applicants must complete and submit an online application using the Research Portal. Students should refer to the CGRS M application instructions (for all applicants) housed on NSERC's website to locate details on how to complete their application (see the link above titled 'Canada Graduate Research Scholarships Master's program'). Additionally a Canadian Common CV (CCV) must be completed and the confirmation number uploaded into the CGRS M application on the Research Portal.

The Research Portal will instruct applicants to select up to three universities where they wish to hold the award. Applicants may select universities on the application where:

- they are currently enrolled in an eligible program of study and wish to pursue their studies; or
- they intend to apply for full-time admission to an eligible program of study if not currently enrolled at a university of their choice.

***Awards must be held at the university where the offer of award originates.**

There will be two attachments that will be uploaded. One is the Outline of Proposed Research (no more than two pages, with **the actual proposal being a maximum of one page in length**. A second page is allowed for citations). This is uploaded as a single PDF attachment. The second upload consists of your official transcripts. You will also complete the Canadian Common CV, which is part of the online application. The confirmation number from the Common CV must be uploaded into the CGSM application on the Research Portal.

A Completed CGSM application will include the following:

- 1) The three-part online application (Identification, Summary of Proposal, and Activity Details)
- 2) Attachments (2) - Outline of proposed research (as a PDF attachment) and **all official academic transcripts**, undergraduate and graduate as one PDF attachment, including exchange/transfer host institutions where the grade does not appear on the home institution transcript and also including one legend for each transcript.
- 3) Canadian Common CV (uploaded as a confirmation number)
- 4) Two completed reference assessments (form completed electronically by the referees)

* Registered students must include a transcript showing Fall 2025 registration.

TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts can take a number of business days to process at some universities. You can have your official University of Toronto emailed to you by ordering through ACORN (www.acorn.utoronto.ca). **Up-to-date transcripts** are defined as transcripts dated or issued in the fall session of the year of application (if currently registered) or after the last term completed (if not currently registered).

The University of Toronto will not reject unofficial transcripts for CGRS M. SGS continues to

recommend that applicants submit official transcripts whenever possible, as they will be easier for reviewers to read, and their authenticity will not be questioned.

Current CSB grads do not need to order transcripts from other universities attended if the CSB Graduate Office has a copy of the original transcript(s) in your student file, provided that the transcript(s) covers all coursework taken through August 31, 2025. The CSB Graduate Office can send you a scanned copy which you will upload yourself, along with a UofT transcript that you will order.

Scanned transcripts have to be upright, in black and white, and **include one legend for each institution**. If there are multiple transcripts, they have to be uploaded together as a single PDF.

REPORTS ON THE APPLICANT (i.e. reference letters)

- Ideally from a person(s) very familiar with applicant's research and other abilities. They should be able to provide specific examples and be knowledgeable in the proposed area of research. Usually the thesis supervisor; or
- From a person sufficiently familiar with applicant's research and other abilities.
- Cannot be from a proposed supervisor unless that person is, or has been, your supervisor.
- Applicants will not have access to the reports, but will be able to see when it is completed, and also have the capability to "unlock" the report, which would allow referees to make amendments

What you should do:

- Contact your proposed referees to ensure they are willing to complete a report for you.
- In the Referee Invitation page of your application, enter the names and e-mail addresses of each of the referees who will be completing a report.
- Once the information is saved, an e-mail containing the appropriate links will be forwarded to the referee so that he or she may view your application and complete the report.
- The status of the request can be verified on this page.

TIPS

*The Research Portal does not permit applications to be returned to applicants for corrections or updates after they have been submitted. All submissions are final.

* Make sure that you are applying to the correct Federal Granting Agency. See the webpage listed below, to ensure that your application is suitable for NSERC or CIHR. Any health-related applications/research proposals should be submitted to the CIHR competition.
